

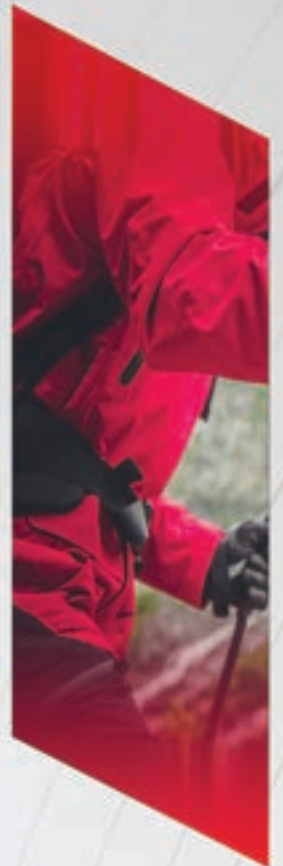
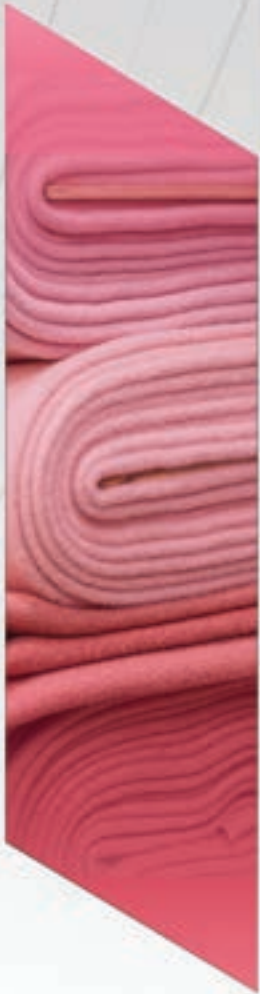

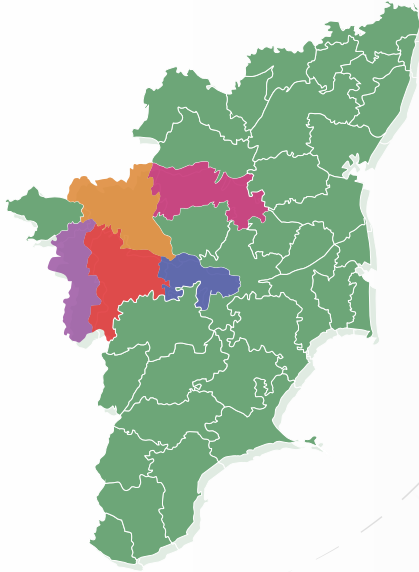

## Overview

Tamil Nadu has a strong ecosystem for Textiles & Apparel. The State marks its overwhelming presence in all the industry sub-sectors, viz., Spinning, Handloom weaving, Power loom weaving, Processing Knitwear, Apparel, Garments and Home Textiles. Tamil Nadu is the leading Textile manufacturing hub in the Country. It accounts for 28% of total employment in the textile sector and contributes 20% total exports of readymade garments from India.

Tamil Nadu is well equipped to further develop the Industry through various interventions and provide a medium to expand and create more jobs.

The vision of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu is to make our State a "One trillion dollar Economy by 2030. To achieve this, the contribution of the Textile Industry in the State will be significant.

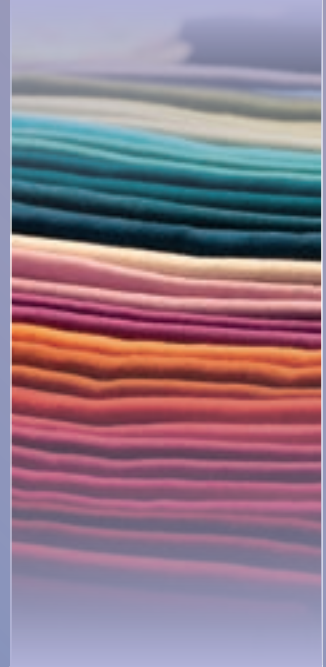


# Tamil Nadu Industrial Policy 2021

Make Tamil Nadu the numero uno destination to invest, innovate and create products and associated services.

## Scope of the Policy

Investments made from January 1, 2021 will be considered eligible for availing incentives  
The policy will be valid till 31.03.2025

#### i) Investment Promotion Subsidy

## ii) Training Subsidy

- Rs 4000 to Rs 6000 per worker per month for 6 months

## iii) Land Cost Incentive

- For eligible projects in SIPCOT
  - 10% concession on land allotment in "A" & "B" districts
  - 50% concession on land allotment in "C" districts

## iv) Interest Subvention

- 5% as a rebate in the rate of interest to Ultra Mega Projects up to Rs.4 crore per annum for a period of 6 years

## v) Standard Incentives

- **Electricity Tax Incentive:** Electricity tax exemption for 5 years on power purchased from TANGEDCO or captive sources
- **Stamp Duty Incentive:** 50% to 100% concession on stamp duty payable on lease or purchase of land/building in parks promoted by SIPCOT
- **Green Industry Incentive:** 25% subsidy subject to a limit of Rs.1 crore on the cost of setting up environmental protection infrastructure such as
  - Safety and Energy Efficiency Solutions
  - Water Conservation Solutions
  - Greening Solutions
- **Quality Certification Incentive:** 50% of the total cost incurred limited to Rs.25 lakh for obtaining certification
- **Intellectual Property Creation Incentive:** Reimbursement of 50% of expenditure subject to maximum of Rs.30 lakh incurred for patent, copyright, trademarks and GI registration



## vi) SGST Refund on Capital Goods

- Refund of the Input SGST paid on capital goods within the standard investment period, to the extent input tax credit is admissible under TNGST Act 2017.

## 2) Special Incentives for Sunrise Sector

- The following incentives are in addition to the Structured Package above and are applicable to projects in the Sunrise Sector – **“Technical Textiles including Medical Textiles”**.

### i) Investment Promotion Subsidy – Sunrise Booster

- Projects in Sunrise Sector industries opting for Flexible Capital Subsidy shall get a Sunrise Booster of one which implies an additional capital subsidy of up to 7.5% of EFA, depending upon the investment and employment.

### ii) Land cost subsidy

- For private land in “C” districts, a 50% subsidy will be offered on the cost of land as per guideline value up to an extent of 50 acres and subject to land cost not exceeding 20% of EFA and a cap of Rs. 2 cr. provided that at least 70% of the land is used for manufacturing operations.

### iii) Stamp Duty Incentive

- For private lands, stamp duty concession will be given as a 100% back - ended subsidy for up to 50 acres on fulfilment of investment and employment commitment.

### iv) Enhanced Incentive for Quality Certification

- A subsidy of 50% of the total cost incurred for obtaining the National or international certification, as certified by the Chartered Accountant, limited to Rs. 1 cr. for the period of investment.

### v) Enhanced Incentive for Intellectual Property Creation

- Reimbursement of 50% of the expenditure incurred by the Project for the investment period for a patent, copyright, trademarks, Geographical Indicators registration subject to a maximum of Rs. 1 crore for the period of investment.



#### vi) Interest Subvention

- 5% as a rebate in the rate of interest to Large, Mega and Ultra Mega Projects up to Rs.0.2 crore, Rs.1 crore and Rs.4 crore respectively per annum for a period of 6 years

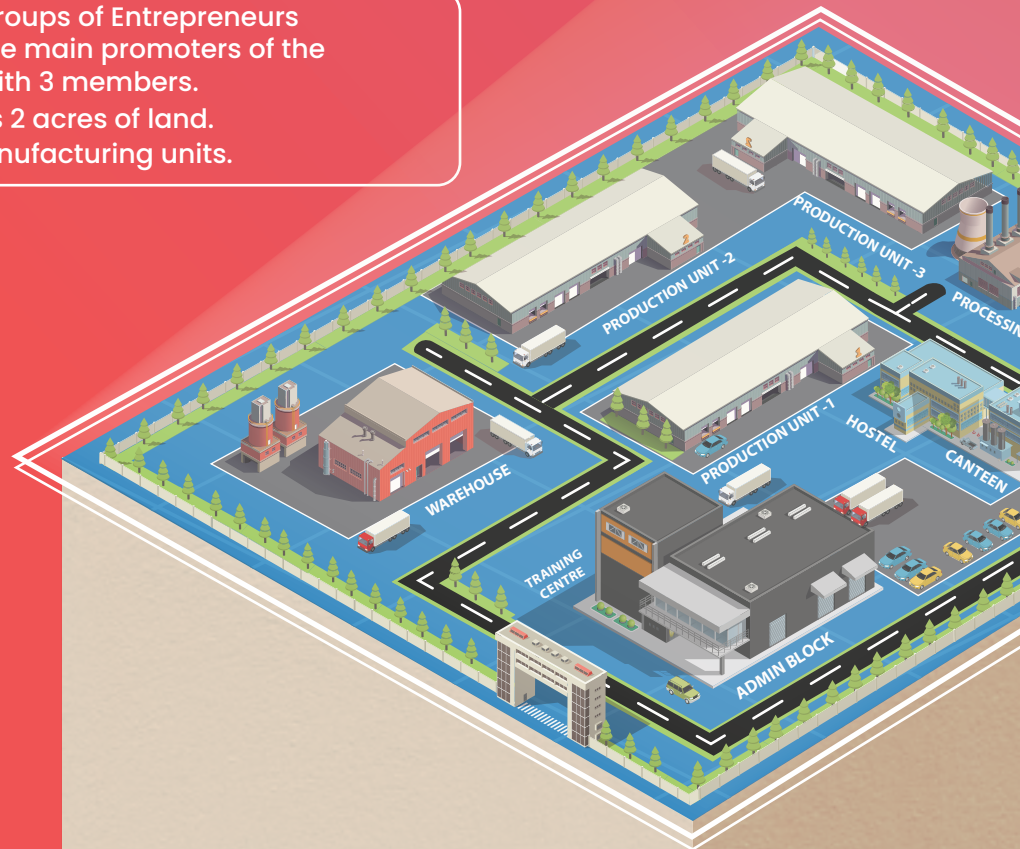

## Components of eligible Project Cost

### 01. Common infrastructure

Roads, Street Lights, compound walls, Drainage, water supply, electricity supply including captive power plant, Effluent Treatment Plant, Tele communication lines etc.

### 02. Common facilities

Testing laboratory, Design Centre, Training centre, Trade Centre, warehousing facility, Raw material depot, Creches, Canteen, Workers hostel, Offices, and others.

### 03. Factory buildings for production purposes

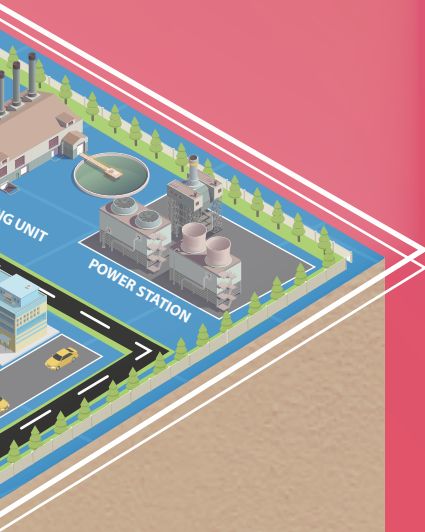
50% of the eligible project cost or Rs.2.50 crores, whichever is less, shall be provided as a grants-in-aid by the State Government.

## Key benefits

- The MSME stakeholders Industry Associations, Groups of Entrepreneurs and Societies will benefit.
- Each Mini Textiles Park is expected to provide direct and indirect employment to around 300 persons.
- Tentative Tax Revenue to the Government is Rs. 50.00 - 100.00 lakhs per annum.
- This scheme will develop Tamil Nadu as a "Textile Focal Point of India" and will generate more Employment in the State.

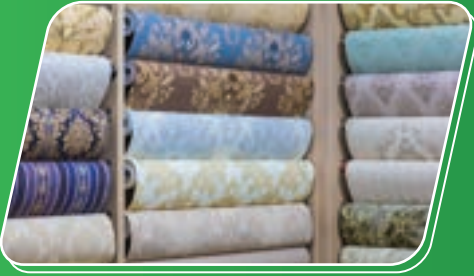

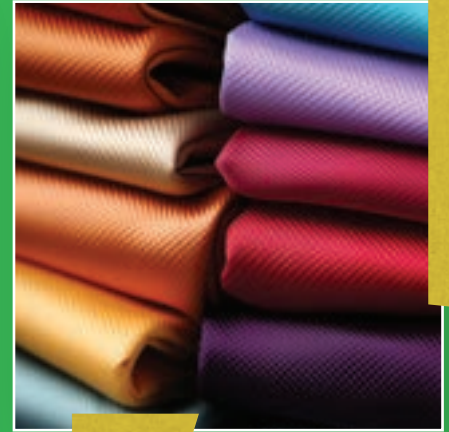

# Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Government of India

## Schemes for MSMEs

### 01. Credit Guarantee Scheme for Micro & Small Enterprises (CGTMSE)

#### ◆ Beneficiaries:

- Existing entrepreneurs and aspiring entrepreneurs.

◆ **Mode of the apply:**

- It could be applied through Member Lending Institutions such as Banks and Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs).

◆ **Financial Assistance:**

- Credit guarantee for loans up to Rs. 2 crores, without collateral and third-party guarantee
- Guarantee coverage ranges from 85% (Micro Enterprise up to Rs 5 lakhs) to 75% (others).
- 50% coverage is for retail activity

## **02. Micro & Small Enterprises Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP) Scheme**

◆ **Objective:**

To create/upgrade infrastructural facilities in the new / existing industrial areas / clusters of MSMEs.

◆ **Beneficiaries:**

The existing entrepreneurs in the form of Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) can avail the following benefits under the scheme.

◆ **Common Facility Centres:**

Creation of “tangible assets” such as Common Production / Processing centers, Design Centers, Testing Facilities including Plug & plug-and-play facilities. GoI Assistance: up to 80% of the maximum Project cost of Rs. 30 crores.

◆ **Infrastructure Development:**

Development of land, roads, drainage, power distribution etc. in new/existing industrial (multi-product) areas/estates/Flatted Factory Complexes. GoI Assistance: up to 70% of the maximum Project cost of Rs. 15 crores.

## 03. Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI)

### ◆ Objective:

To organize traditional industries and artisans into collectives by increasing production and value addition to make products competitive.

### ◆ Beneficiaries:

- Existing artisans from traditional industries in sectors such as Handicraft, Textile, Coir, Khadi etc.,
- Govt support:
  - Upto Rs. 2.5 cr. for upto 500 artisans
  - Rs. 5 cr for more than 500 artisans.

### ◆ Details:

- Artisans are constituted into Special Purpose Vehicles (SPVs) by Implementing Agencies (State/Central Govt. organizations, NGOs) who need to provide land and 10% of Hard Intervention
- Financial assistance of up to 90% of Hard Intervention cost, the entire cost of Soft Intervention, Technical Agency fee and Implementing Agency fee is given by Govt

### ◆ Objective:

To promote new enterprises, capacity building of existing MSMEs and inculcating entrepreneurial culture in the country.

Aspiring and existing entrepreneurs





◆ **Mode of the apply:**

- It could be applied through Member Lending Institutions such as Banks and Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs).

◆ **Different programs conducted under this scheme are as below**

- A. Entrepreneurship Awareness Programme (EAP)
- B. Entrepreneurship cum Skill Development Programme (E-SDP)
- C. Management Development Programme (MDP)
- D. Advance E-SDP & advance MDP

## **05. Procurement and Marketing Support (PMS) Scheme**

### **Scheme Components**

◆ **Market Access:**

- Participation of Individual MSEs in Trade Fairs / Exhibitions.
- Organizing Domestic/ International Trade Fairs/Exhibition and participation in trade fairs/exhibitions by the Ministry/Office of DC (MSME)/Government organizations.
- Vendor Development Program (VDP)

◆ **Capacity Building:**

- Adoption of Modern Packaging Techniques
- Adoption of Bar Code
- Adoption of e-Commerce Platform
- National Workshops / Seminars
- Organizing National workshops/seminars by the Ministry / Office of DC (MSME) (Conventional/Virtual).

◆ **Development of Retail Outlet:**

- Financial Assistance for the development of outlets for promoting GI tag products.
- Maximum amount Rs.30.00 lakh for Metro cities and Rs.20.00 Lakh for other cities.



## 06. International Cooperation (IC) Scheme: Market Development Assistance of MSMEs (MDA)

### ◆ Objective:

To build the Capacity of MSMEs for entering the export market.

### ◆ Beneficiaries:

State/Central Government Organizations/Institutions and Registered Industry/Enterprise Associations etc,

## Financial Assistance:

### ◆ Participation in International Exhibition, Trade fairs and buyer-seller meets in foreign countries:

- Space Rent (Stall Charges): Upto Rs. 3.00 lakh per MSME.
- Air Fare : Upto Rs.1.50 lakh per MSME
- Duty allowance: USD150 per day for Office Bearer
- Freight charges: Upto Rs.50,000/-per MSME unit and Rs.75,000/-per MSME for Latin American Countries.
- Advertisement and publicity charges: Upto Rs.5.00 lakh
- Registration fee: Upto Rs.5,000/-

### ◆ Participation in International Exhibition, Trade fairs and Buyer Seller meets by foreign organisers (Virtual Mode)

- Space/Stall Charges including catalogue/digital material charges for Participating in the Virtual International Events organized by foreign countries: Upto Rs.1.5 lakh.
- Advertisement and Publicity Charges: Upto Rs.5.00 lakh

### ◆ Organizing International conferences/ summits/ workshops/Seminars on themes relevant to the MSME sector (Physical Mode) to be organized in India by the Industry Associations/Government Organizations

- Charges for holding/organizing the International conferences/summits/workshops/seminars in India by Industry Associations including charges for venue rent, catering, advertisement & publicity, security arrangement, etc. : Upto Rs.10.00 lakh.

- Economy class Airfare for foreign speakers/experts/resource persons: Upto Rs.5.00 lakh.

## Mode of the apply:

- ◆ **Organising International conferences/ summits/workshops/ seminars on the themes relevant to MSME sector (Virtual Mode) to be organized by Industry Associations/ Government Organizations**
  - It could be applied through Member Lending Institutions such as Banks and Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs).
  - Virtual Space /Platform/License Fee/Rent for Organising Conferences /summits/ workshops/seminars: Upto Rs. 2.00 lakh.
  - Publicity cost incurred on promotion/marketing/pubilicity of the event : upto Rs. 5 lakh
  - Translation and Interpretation charges involved in the virtual event: Upto Rs.1.00 lakh.

## 07. A scheme for Promotion of Innovation, Rural Industries and Entrepreneurship (ASPIRE)

### ◆ Objective:

To set up a network of Livelihood Business Incubators (LBIs), predominantly in rural and underserved areas, to generate employment opportunities, provide skilled human capital to nearby industrial clusters and promote innovations.

### ◆ Beneficiaries:

Any agency/institution of the Government of India/ State government or existing training centers under Ministries/Departments of the Government of India/State Government, Industry Associations, Academic Institutions are eligible to avail the benefits

### ◆ Benefits:

- Maximum of Rs.1.00crore to Government Agencies and Rs.75 .00 lakh to Private agencies for procuring plant and machinery.



- Maximum of Rs.1.00 crore to Government and Private agencies as operational expenditure support towards manpower cost, running incubation and skill development programmers, etc.

## 08. Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP)

- It is the World Bank supported Central Sector Scheme aimed at improving access of MSMEs to market, finance and technology upgradation by enhancing the outreach of existing Ministry of MSME schemes.
- It would enhance the performance of MSMEs by promoting technology upgradation, innovation, digitization, market access, credit, greening initiatives, etc through active participation of the State Governments.
- Individual MSMEs can apply through State Government/Agencies.
